

PROJECT: EACH ONE, TEACH ONE

The NSS society of Vivekananda Institute of Professional Studies was established with an objective - *to make this world a better place to live in.*

Under its aegis, on 5th October, 2018, project, '*Each one, Teach one*', was initiated. The main target of this project was to educate and empower those children who are deprived of the basic facilities of life.



The SFU of NSS, VIPS, provided education to about 150 students from the economically deprived section of the neighbouring Haiderpur village. The learning was spread over an hour daily in the premises of the institute. The project was held under the guidance of Prof. (Dr.) Shilpa Khatri Babbar, Director, Academics and Students' Welfare, VIPS and Dr. Renu Vashisth, Nodal Officer, NSS, VIPS.



The project started with an orientation programme on 5th October, 2018, making the team aware of the objective. The programme was divided into 4 weeks with different modules for each week which covered a variety of topics ranging from personal hygiene to basic

etiquettes. The students were divided into groups of six. This project involved around 100 members of the SFU.

In the first week, focus was on basic human rights, moral values, simple mathematics, national symbols and basic etiquettes. Second week focused on issues such as mental health and cleanliness, communicable diseases, good touch and bad touch along with general knowledge, information about planets, basic mathematics and English.

The third week focused on importance of table manners, different inventions around the globe, shapes, basic multiplication, and different parts of a plant, sense organs and body parts.

The last and the final week focused on revision. Ice-breaking activities were also included in the project to provide a comfortable and friendly environment.

Along with teaching, care was taken about the essential modalities to make the programme a success. During the course of this project, a total of 7 members worked in the logistics department and 3 members were part of the finance department. The discipline team comprised of 15 members and a team of 20 people was formed to design the modules according to the needs and wants of the students.



The project came to an end on 31st October, 2018.

Observation: Massive improvement was seen in the confidence of the students. Team received a lot of appreciation for

their outstanding work.

A video collage was made, capturing the snippets from the entire month and played for the students to relish their presence and learning. Dr. S. C. Vats, Chairman, VIPS, took an interactive session with the under-privileged children. He also appreciated the initiative taken by the NSS society and congratulated the team for their success. Finally, after the long hard work and achieving the desired results, the students were waived good bye with some refreshments.
