

Participation of VIPS in National Youth Day Celebration in tie-up with YOUTH FOR SEVA

On 17th and 22nd January 2019, 100+ volunteers from NSS Society of Vivekananda Institute of Professional Studies along with the YOUTH FOR SEVA organization, celebrated the National Youth Day at 10 different schools in north Delhi.

This day is celebrated in the name of Swami Vivekananda Ji who inspired and taught various principles like honesty, truthfulness and patience.

The programme on 17th January began with the volunteers of NSS SOCIETY of VIPS being warmly welcomed by batch of students from class 6th to 12th. In some schools, the students were gathered in one hall/ground and in others, classes were allotted and accordingly the volunteers were divided and took the command.

The session was started by our volunteers with a small biography on Swami Vivekananda Ji , being followed by four to five short stories on principles like truth, being confidence and patience. Then there was another round wherein students narrated more stories and shared the teaching morals on today's world and youth. Looking at the enthusiasm and interest of the students, the sessions were made interactive by fun games and small quizzes. The number of students for this day varied from 300 to 700 for each school.

The volunteers revisited the schools on 22nd January 2019 to conduct a quiz about Swami Vivekananda Ji and General Knowledge. The students were already provided with the books through the organization to prepare for the same. On this day, the quiz was MCQ based and was conducted in two batches (6th to 8th and 9th to 12th) in their respective classes or halls. After the one hour quiz, the papers were checked by the volunteers there itself and the results were declared with top 3 from each batch. The number of participation from each school varied from 100 to 210 for the quiz. The results very well depicted that the students there were quite smart and took great interest on 17th.

This two day event was a big opportunity for the volunteers to learn and interact with school students and enhance their confidence levels. The volunteers observed that in classrooms, there were kids with diverse backgrounds and nature. The volunteers learnt to love each one of them equally. Volunteers recognized that no matter how different the students are from them or each other, there's something special in everyone!









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
